We hope to be able to replace the deteriorated planks on that wall as well as planks and beams on the back- kitchen wall.

Our grant writing efforts will certainly continue into 2021 with the hopes of securing enough funding to complete this work.

As the town was bombarded by the British warships more than once, there are very few pre-Revolutionary houses remaining in Marcus Hook, with the exception of the Plank House!

Marcus Hook served as a defensive post along the Delaware River with over 5,000 US troops placed there.

The Plank House is worth saving, and it is our mission to restore it so that we might preserve history for all future generations!
